After Action Report Battle of Sandy Hollow

Hosted by the 43rd Regiment of Foot on a 300 acre park which was part of the original Brandywine battlefield, this event was a pure joy to have been a part of. Although there was a light rain Friday night, setup was not hindered greatly and Saturday morning's events went off without a hitch.

Forming the right wing of the British line, the Royal Welch Fusiliers advanced on the enemy in solid lines firing well timed and significant volleys as they proceeded to push the Rebel line back onto its own guns and eventually off the field.

Birmingham Township pulled out all the stops for this event and the enthusiasm of the large crowds on both days was refreshing. Unlike many other events these folks had done some homework and had some pretty intelligent questions.

Several representatives of the British Army were also on hand to inspect and enjoy the show and their praise of both the Royal Welch and the other battalions was gratifying to all.

Saturday night the Royal Welch retired to the Dilworthstown Inn for dinner and were treated to a sumptuous meal in authentic surroundings. Toasts were made in profusion and a small party even joined the owner in his tavern afterwards to regale the guests with a rousing version of "Men of Harlech." The owner was delighted and opened to us the hospitality of his establishment.

Sunday saw an American victory which ended the weekends festivities and we retired home and back to the 20th century with the feeling of a job well done.
